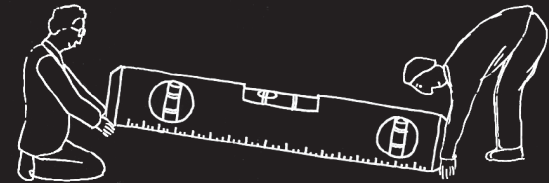

Using applied economic theory and empirical techniques, we assess whether firms have substantial market power, whether there is an abuse of market position, whether competition is being harmed, quantify expected concentration efficiencies, and whether state aid constitutes a distortion of competition.

State aid

CEG economists have extensive experience in applying economic and financial analysis to help public and private sector clients in Article 107 cases.

For ex ante assessment of planned aid measures, we provide economic advice on the design of state support so that it does not constitute State aid and not require notification. In notification procedures, we conduct economic analysis to assess whether a measure is compatible with the internal market. In investigations of aid measures that are already in place or for ex post assessments, we prepare persuasive supporting economic analysis on whether a measure is compatible or whether conditions for compatibility have been met consistently.

We have a strong understanding in the application of the market economy operator (MEO) test in a wide range of aid measures. We assess the existence of market failures, risks of competition distortions, and the balance of positive and negative effects of State aid.

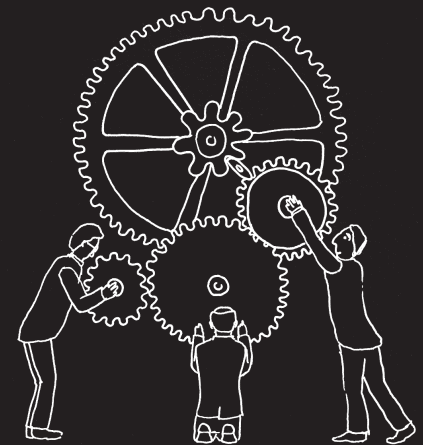
